Overall status

Key points: As per NZ Government instruction, the Auckland region continues to operate under Level 3 lockdown until midnight Wednesday 26th August 2020.

Anyone coming into the Road Office must wear appropriate PPE and adhere to social distancing rules. We need your help to keep the port open. Ensure your staff know how to protect themselves from infection. If any of your staff are sick or displaying any symptoms, please ensure they do not come to the port.

Today is the last day for the <u>voluntary COVID testing</u> that can be done at the Ports of Auckland testing facility at Tinley Street. <u>This is only for the white port access card holders.</u> The facility will be open until 7.15pm this evening. Testing can also be done at two testing sites at the below addresses:

Container Terminal Operations

Berth windows and vessel schedules – Please continue to monitor POAL <u>website</u> for latest updates. Please note vessel arrivals are being affected by delays at other Ports.

'ANL Emora 2021' (ANL TTS) is arriving late tonight and will start its operation after midnight. She will be working at Fergusson North. 'MP THE BELCHICK KE030A' (KEX) will be making a combined South & North bound call into Auckland on Saturday 22 August. 'Hansa Freyberg 2021' this week's **ANL TTS** service vessel is running late, arriving off window on Monday 24 August. 'TIANJIN BRIDGE 141' (NZS/KIX) was delayed in Asia and will be arriving well off its window on Thursday 27 August. 'Seaspan Fraser 083S' (NEASIA) and 'Kota Lihat LIH165' (CNS/ANZEX) are running late however will be arriving within their respective proforma windows. 'Olivia Maersk' (OC1) is running late and will omit Auckland next Tuesday 25th August. Labour supply - still meeting demand. **Yard Capacity** – yard capacity at Terminal approx. **105%.** Please expect delays to truck turn times and limitations in our ability to provide any additional VBS slots. Road Services – another challenging weekend for our R&D operations, however, overall, we had a reasonable run. Over the course of 48 hours we have delivered 492 import containers via road and 162 containers have been railed out. The lower import number can be attributed to late arriving vessels over the weekend. Average truck turn times have not exceeded 27 minutes. We are continuing to use both manual and A-Strad truck grids. **Productivity** – working well Rail Services – working well Other – Please ensure to practice social distancing and PPE gear including face masks. Note no visitors to the Port as the Corporate teams are all working remotely. **Multi-Cargo Operations** Berth and Yard Capacity - Jellicoe / Freyberg available yard capacity is at approx. 70% with Shed space at 20% available. Yard capacity for cars is currently at 20% and decreasing with multiple vessel calls this week. Road Services - Container and Breakbulk R&D will continue to be busy for both receivals and deliveries. Car transporters are struggling to deliver the heavy volumes. Other – COVID testing continues onsite, please continue to be considerate
